

REGULATIONS
FOR THE THREE MINUTES THESIS® COMPETITION

General provisions

§ 1

1. The organiser of the 3MT® Competition is the Warsaw University of Technology, which runs the Doctoral School of the Warsaw University of Technology, hereinafter referred to as the 'Organiser'. The co-organisers of the competition are the Medical University of Warsaw, which runs the Doctoral School of the Medical University of Warsaw, and the Doctoral Students' Council of the Warsaw University of Technology, hereinafter collectively referred to as the 'Co-organisers', and individually as a 'Co-organiser'.
2. The aim of the 3MT® Competition is to choose the best three-minute oral presentation on a doctoral research project and its significance for society, delivered by a participant in front of an audience and a jury during the 3MT® Competition.
3. The 3MT® competition gives PhD students the opportunity to present the results of their research to a wide and diverse audience, whilst avoiding oversimplifying the subject of their research.
4. The official sub-website for the 3MT® Competition is the 3MT® tab on the website of the Doctoral School of the Warsaw University of Technology, hereinafter referred to as the 'Website'.

Participation in the 3MT® Competition

§ 2

1. Participants in the 3MT® Competition, hereinafter referred to as 'Participants', may be PhD students who:
 - 1) during the 3MT® Competition, they are PhD students at the Doctoral School of the Warsaw University of Technology or the Doctoral School of the Medical University of Warsaw; it is the Organiser's responsibility to confirm the status of a PhD student at the Doctoral School of the Warsaw University of Technology, whilst confirmation of doctoral student status at the Doctoral School of the Medical University of Warsaw is the responsibility of the Medical University of Warsaw, hereinafter also referred to as 'WUM';
 - 2) are currently registered as PhD students;
 - 3) their studies at the Doctoral School have not been suspended;
 - 4) personally conducted or co-conducted the research on which the presentation is based.
2. Participants must submit a correctly completed entry form, in accordance with the 3MT® Competition schedule. The entry form is available on the 3MT® Competition website.
3. The Organiser and Co-organisers recommend that, before submitting a presentation to the 3MT Competition®, participants should consult with the supervisors of their research regarding the scope of information to be disclosed, given that the content of the competition presentation, including the research results presented therein, will be publicly available on the internet, resulting in the dissemination of this data to the general public.

4. The total number of Participants eligible to take part in the 3MT® Competition is limited to 70, unless otherwise stated on the Website, divided as follows:

1) The total number of participants from the Doctoral School of the Medical University of Warsaw who may take part in the 3MT® Competition qualifiers is limited to 20. Acceptance is determined by the order in which applications are received;

2) The total number of participants eligible to take part in the 3MT® Competition qualifiers organised by the Doctoral School of the Warsaw University of Technology is limited to 50. Acceptance is determined by the order in which applications are received.

5. Participation in the 3MT® Competition is free of charge.

6. The organiser requires participants in the 3MT® Competition to provide the following details:

- 1) first name and surname;
- 2) an email address on the WUT or WUM domain;
- 3) telephone number.

7. The organiser requires the winner of the 3MT® Competition to provide the following details:

- 1) correspondence address (for sending the prize);
- 2) tax identification number (NIP) or personal identification number (PESEL);
- 3) date of birth and any other details required to pay out the cash prize.

8. The results of the 3MT® Competition will be made public by publishing them on the Warsaw University of Technology and Warsaw Medical University websites.

9. The organiser has implemented appropriate measures to ensure a level of security appropriate to the risk, taking into account the technical knowledge available, the cost of implementation, and the nature, scope, purpose and context of the data processing, as well as the risk of infringement of the rights and freedoms of individuals with varying degrees of likelihood and severity of the threat.

10. The organiser takes particular account of the risks associated with data processing arising from:

- 1) accidental or unlawful destruction;
- 2) loss, alteration or unauthorised disclosure of data;
- 3) unauthorised access to personal data that is transmitted, stored or otherwise processed.

11. The organiser will not reimburse any costs incurred by participants in connection with their participation in the 3MT® Competition.

The course of the competition

§ 3

1. The 3MT® competition is held in Warsaw, at the Warsaw University of Technology and the Medical University of Warsaw.

2. The 3MT® competition consists of three stages:

1) Stage I – submitting an application for the 3MT® Competition to the following email address:

a) for students enrolled at the Doctoral School of the Warsaw University of Technology: projekty.sd@pw.edu.pl,

b) for students at the Doctoral School of the Medical University of Warsaw: szkoladoktorska@wum.edu.pl;

2) Stage II – the eliminations will be held separately for those studying in:

a) the Doctoral School of the Warsaw University of Technology,

b) the Doctoral School of the Medical University of Warsaw;

3) Stage III – the final will take place at the Warsaw University of Technology.

3. The specific venues and dates for each stage of the 3MT® Competition will be announced on the website.

4. Participants may submit the slide illustrating their competition presentation, as referred to in § 4 section 6, by email to the address provided by the Organiser in their correspondence with participants in the 3MT® Competition, no later than 7 days before the start of Stages II and III.

Presentations

§ 4

1. The task of a 3MT® Competition participant is to give a personal presentation directly to the audience and the jury, during which they will outline their research and its significance for society.

2. The presentation referred to in paragraph 1 shall be delivered by the Participant in English and must not exceed 3 minutes.

3. The criteria for assessing each presentation are:

1) comprehensibility – the extent to which the presentation enables the audience to understand the research, in particular:

a) a clear definition of the nature and purpose of the research,

b) a presentation of the most important issues relating to the research topic,

c) a logical and coherent structure of the presentation;

2) engagement – the extent to which a presentation captures the audience's interest, in particular:

a) avoiding oversimplification of the research topic,

b) demonstrating one's own enthusiasm and commitment to the research,

c) encouraging the audience to learn more about the research being presented;

3) communication style – the extent to which content is presented using language appropriate for a broad and diverse audience, in particular:

- a) maintaining eye contact, modulating the voice appropriately, speaking at a suitable pace and demonstrating self-confidence,
- b) avoiding academic jargon, explaining specialist terminology and providing the necessary academic context,
- c) the conciseness, legibility and clarity of the slides displayed during the presentation and their impact on the reception of the presentation,
- d) managing the presentation time effectively.

4. Each presentation is assessed according to its fulfilment of the criteria referred to in paragraph 3, on a scale of 1 to 10 points. This scale is used in Stages II and III of the 3MT® Competition. The jury awards only full marks, entering them on the voting forms. Participants are not entitled to inspect the voting forms once they have been completed by the jury members.

5. The speech should be addressed to a wide audience.

6. Participants may display only one static slide prepared in .ppt or .jpg format, which must be submitted to the Organiser in the form and by the deadline specified in § 3 section 4. The slide must not contain any transitions, animations or other dynamic effects. The slide remains on screen for the entire duration of the presentation.

7. Participants must not use any additional electronic media, in particular audio files and video material.

8. Participants must not use any additional equipment, in particular costumes, musical instruments or laboratory apparatus. Participants must also not read from a piece of paper or any other source, with the exception of text displayed on a slide.

9. Participants' presentations must not exceed 3 minutes. Exceeding this time limit will result in the Participant's immediate and irreversible disqualification.

10. Participants' performances must not take the form of a poem or a song.

11. Participants must deliver their speeches whilst standing on stage. This requirement does not apply to participants with mobility disabilities.

12. The countdown of the presentation time begins the moment the Participant starts their presentation, either by making their first movement or speaking their first words.

13. Participants acknowledge that the final of the 3MT® Competition will be broadcast live via external online platforms (YouTube or Facebook), through the official channels of the Warsaw University of Technology. The processing of personal data is carried out in accordance with the law and the policies of the data administrators and the terms and conditions of the platforms used.

14. Participants may consent to the use of their image, including their voice, for the purpose of promoting the 3MT® Competition via commercial social media platforms and the websites of the Warsaw University of Technology and the Medical University of Warsaw. The Participant's declaration regarding authorship, licences, image rights and the processing of personal data is set out in Appendix 1 to these Rules.

15. Detailed information regarding the processing of the personal data of 3MT® Competition participants can be found in Annexes 2 and 2a to these Rules, respectively.

Selection of the winners and awarding of the prizes

§ 5

1. The winners of the 3MT® Competition are selected by a jury, with the exception of the audience award, which is decided by the audience.

2. In the 3MT® Competition:

1) Stage II (elimination round) ends with 12 participants qualifying for Stage III (final);

2) Stage III (the final) ends with the awarding of one main prize for first place, one prize for second place, one prize for third place, one audience award and three special prizes.

3. Cash prizes are gross amounts.

4. PhD students at the Warsaw University of Technology's Doctoral School who qualify for the second stage (elimination round) and third stage (final) of the 3MT® Competition will receive credit at the Warsaw University of Technology's Doctoral School for a researchers' workshop worth 1 ECTS, and will be awarded the following learning outcomes: SDS_U4, SD_U6, SD_U7, SD_K3, SD_K5. PhD students who take part in the final event (after registering on the list) will be credited with 5 hours of participation in an interdisciplinary seminar.

5. PhD students at the Doctoral School of the Medical University of Warsaw who reach the second stage (elimination round) and the third stage (final) of the 3MT® Competition are exempt from the obligation to actively participate in a national or international scientific conference during their studies at the Doctoral School of the Medical University of Warsaw. A PhD student at the Doctoral School of the Medical University of Warsaw who takes first place in the third stage (final) of the 3MT® Competition will be credited with 12 hours of 'Multidisciplinary seminars' from the fourth year of their studies at the Doctoral School of the Medical University of Warsaw.

The Jury

§ 6

1. The organiser appoints a jury before each stage of the 3MT® Competition.

2. The jury chooses a Head from amongst its members.

3. The jury shall consist of at least three people, including representatives of: the Organiser, the Co-organisers (including their organisational units), the media, entrepreneurs and public institutions.

4. The jury's tasks include listening to the presentations and awarding marks for each presentation on a scale of 1 to 10, in accordance with the three criteria set out in § 4, section 3.

5. The jury's decisions are taken by a majority vote. In the event of a tie between several candidates, the vote of the Head of the jury shall be decisive.

6. The jury reserves the right not to award any prizes if the standard of the presentations does not meet the requirements of the Rules and Regulations or the criteria set by the organiser of the

3MT® Competition. The jury also reserves the right to allocate the prizes differently (whilst maintaining their maximum total value), i.e. to award joint prizes.

7. The jury's decisions are final and unquestionable.

8. Winning first, second or third place, or special prizes, does not exclude the possibility of receiving the audience award.

9. The 3MT® Contest participant who receives the highest number of votes from the audience will be awarded the audience prize. In the event that more than one participant receives the same number of votes, the jury will decide who is awarded the prize.

10. The public will be able to vote online. To this purpose, the Organiser has set up an online voting system, which will be made available to the public via social media during the final of the 3MT® Competition. Participation in the public vote is anonymous and does not involve the processing of voters' personal data.

11. The results of the 3MT® Competition will be announced by the judging panel at the end of each stage of the Competition.

12. Prizes will be awarded to the winners after verification of their personal details, within 30 days of the above conditions being met.

13. The value and types of awards will be announced on the websites of the Doctoral School of the Warsaw University of Technology and the Doctoral School of the Medical University of Warsaw.

Rights of the Organisers

§ 7

1. The Organiser and Co-organisers reserve the right to publish competition presentations free of charge on the websites and social media profiles of the Organiser and the Medical University of Warsaw, subject to the Participant's consent, a template for which is set out in Appendix 1 to these rules.

2. The organiser shall respect the author's moral rights, in particular by crediting the Participant's competition entry with their first name and surname.

3. The organiser reserves the right to:

1) cancel the 3MT® Competition if an insufficient number of applications are received;

2) make changes to the schedule of the 3MT® Competition;

3) change the nature of the prizes.

4. Any changes to the Rules will be published immediately on the 3MT® Competition website.

Final provisions

§ 8

1. Participation in the 3MT® Competition constitutes acceptance of these Rules and Regulations, together with the appendices.

2. These Rules and Regulations are the only document setting out the rules of the 3MT® Competition.

3. Each Participant has the right to contact the Organiser or Co-organiser at the addresses specified in paragraph 4 to seek clarification on the content of these Rules. The interpretation of the provisions of these Rules rests with the Organiser and Co-organisers of the 3MT® Competition.

4. Any questions related to the 3MT® Competition should be sent by email, as appropriate, to the following addresses:

5. The Organiser and Co-organisers of the Competition shall not be held liable for the cancellation of the 3MT® Competition or for changes to the schedule arising from causes beyond their control.

1. 4. I agree to release the Organisers from all liability in the event that third parties bring any claims relating to an infringement of their rights in connection with the Organisers' use of the Work, including covering the costs of any legal proceedings that may arise.

II. Non-exclusive licence agreement for the use of the Work

1. I hereby grant the Organisers a free, non-exclusive licence, unlimited in terms of territory and duration (for a period of 10 years from the date of signing this declaration), to use the Work, recorded in the form of an audiovisual recording during my presentation at the 3MT® Competition, for informational, promotional, reporting and educational purposes relating to the Organisers' statutory activities.
2. The licence is granted for the following fields of exploitation:

1) with regard to the recording and copying of the Work and its performance – the production, by any means, of copies of a recording of the performance, including by magnetic, optical and digital means (in formats such as MP4, AVI, etc.), on any medium;

2) with regard to digital recording and network distribution – uploading the recording to the memory of the Organisers' computers and network servers, and to computer networks (including the intranet and the public Internet);

If you consent to the dissemination of your image (including statements made by you), the Administrator will also process your personal data for the purpose of promoting the competition through commercial social media and on the Warsaw University of Technology website. The legal basis for processing your personal data is Article 6(1)(a) of the GDPR and Article 81 of the Copyright and Related Rights Act (Journal of Laws of 2022, item 2509).

4. Your personal data will be processed by the Administrator to the following extent:
 - 1) competition participants – first name, surname, e-mail address in the WUT domain, telephone number, image and voice (if qualified for the competition final);
 - 2) competition winners – first name, surname, correspondence address, NIP/PESEL number, date of birth, and data necessary for the payment of the monetary prize.
5. Warsaw University of Technology does not intend to transfer your personal data outside the European Economic Area.
6. You have the right to access your personal data and the right to correct it, the right to request erasure, restriction of processing, and the right to object to the processing of personal data. Pursuant to the provisions of Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 27 April 2016 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data, and repealing Directive 95/46/EC (General Data Protection Regulation, hereinafter also referred to as the “GDPR”), the Medical University of Warsaw hereby informs you that:

3. Your personal data will be processed **for the purposes** of organising the THREE MINUTES THESIS® competition, developed by The University of Queensland in Australia, of which the Medical University of Warsaw is a co-organisier.
4. Your personal data may be processed **for the purpose** of establishing and pursuing potential claims or defending against such claims, i.e. for the purpose of pursuing the legally legitimate interest consisting in defending against your claims or pursuing potential claims, as well as for contact purposes.
5. **The legal basis** for processing your personal data is Article 6(1)(c) and (e) and Article 9(2)(h) of the General Data Protection Regulation, i.e.: the processing is necessary for compliance with a legal obligation to which the Administrator is subject (e.g. in connection with the provisions of the Act of 29 June 1995 on Official Statistics, the Act of 20 July 2018 – Law on Higher Education and Science and the implementing regulations thereto, including health-related data), and the processing is necessary for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest (e.g. administration and implementation of the educational process). In the case of the pursuit of the legitimate interests referred to in point 4, the legal basis for processing is Article 6(1)(f) of the GDPR.
6. Providing your personal data is voluntary; however, it is necessary for the purposes for which the data have been collected. Failure to provide the required data will result in the inability to participate in the THREE MINUTES THESIS® competition.
7. 8. Your personal data will be stored for the period **required by law** and for the period necessary to pursue the Administrator’s legitimate interests. 11. Your personal data will not be processed for any purpose other than that for which they were collected.

Your personal data **may be transferred** to a recipient in a third country or to an international organisation; however, you will be informed in advance of such transfer and of the measures taken by the Administrator in this regard, in accordance with the provisions of Chapter V of the General Data Protection Regulation.
13. You **have the right to lodge a complaint** with the supervisory authority, i.e. the President of the Personal Data Protection Office.
